NOTICE: There will be no formal presentation or business meeting on February 12, but members will be present to discuss gem show topics.

A quorum of the membership was present, at least 40 members.

The speaker was Larry Fellowes, speaking "The Grand Canyon: The Rest of the Story," a beautiful photographic exhibit of Arizona's greatest attraction.

Members approved a motion to donate the Ron Davison Memorial Fund of \$350 to the Alfie Norville Mining and Mineral Museum, plus \$650 from an anonymous donor, plus \$127 raffle proceeds from this meeting.

The minutes of the December membership meeting were approved by members.

New and re-elected officers and board members were sworn in as required by the Bylaws.

Treasurer's Report (Mark Davidson) – (added when available) The net income for the year 2021 was positive. Income exceeded expenses by almost twofold. Just 54% of the annual budget for 2021 was spent. New income is being generated by the sale of advertising in the newsletter.

The budget for 2022 was approved with few changes from 2021.

Membership Report (Janet Keisler) – 191 members have joined or renewed for 2022 so far.

Field trip is planned to the peridot site in the White Hills for February 22.

Jewelry items are solicited for our display case at the Gem Show. Give items to David Schulte. Photograph them first, or otherwise identify them.

Changes in Bylaws: Reduce age of junior members from 8 to 6. (This does not affect limits for field trips or labs.) – Approved by members. The renewal fee for junior members is reduced from \$12.50 to \$10 – Approved by members.





MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 1, 2022 OPLC BOARD MEETING

Present: Dave Richardson presiding (Victoria absent), Bill Penrose, Mark Davidson, David Schulte, Mike Tucker, Ted Rupp, John Poole, Pete Peterson, Wayne Klement, Jan Keisler, Twink Monrad, Donovan Wagner, Elizabeth Boccardo, and Brian Peterson.

A quorum was present.

Treasurer's Report - Mark Davidson – Due to reduced activity, only 54% of the 2021 budget was spent. The club ended the year with a significant surplus, some of which was put into a new CD.

Financing for the Hob Nob was finalized. Attendees pay \$10 which covers some of the cost of a catered meal; the meals cost \$15 but the difference will be made up from other sources, such as facility rental.

Membership - Jan Keisler – 241 members are signed up for 2022 so far. Dues for 2022 are due now. Monitors to be notified that admission to labs depends on being a member in good standing. Moreover, our liability insurance only applies to members in good standing.

Silent Auction: Danny Harmsen, Dave Richardson reporting – large donations of beads and stone have been received. Two equipment items will be acknowledged in the newsletter.

Labs status:

Cab lab – Mike Tucker/Donovan Wagner – The right hand slab saw has a noisy bearing.

The cab lab often runs out of oil, but there is no way a monitor can get into the saw room for more oil. Oil cannot be stored in the cab lab, as it tends to disappear.

Donovan will buy some new templates to replace the broken and damaged ones.

Faceting - Dave Richardson – Attendance has been reduced, but another lab session is being scheduled. Preparations are being made for the Faceters' Guild meeting.

Casting - no report

Silver – John Poole – Defective torches have been replaced and sent for servicing. The gas pressure will be reduced to 5 psi to prevent flashbacks.

Saw room – Mike Tucker – The 24" blade has been installed. The bad clutch on one saw is being repaired.

Field trips: – Victoria has been arranging a peridot field trip, date TBD.

Gem Show – Volunteers are still needed for manning the booth, as well as setup and teardown. Wendy Huber has taken the lead on this.

New Business -

County Fair signup sheets will be posted this week.



Wayne Klement noted that the Bylaws are not consistent with the membership form, and made changes in the Bylaws to comply.


