

January 8, 2022 OPLC speaker - Dr. Larry Fellows

The Grand Canyon- The Rest of the Story







We are in for another great treat for our January 8, 2022, OPLC monthly meeting. Past Arizona State Geologist and retired Director of the Arizona Geological Survey, Dr. Larry Fellows, will be presenting to us **The Grand Canyon – The Rest of the Story**.

Larry is a returned speaker to OPLC; he has given us two great presentations on the Geologic Features in Southern Arizona and Pompeii and Herculaneum. Giving a description of his talk, Larry said that, "The Grand Canyon tells me four stories, the first and most obvious being its size and color. This is what attracts the tourists; no signs or ranger explanations are necessary. It is awesome! The other three stories about the Canyon pertain to the geologic history of its roof, its walls, and its 'basement.' My guess is that most tourists leave the Canyon with little, if any, understanding of those three interesting and fascinating aspects, the rest of the story. They are the subject of my presentation: Grand Canyon - the rest of the story." He continued saying, "Arizonans are fortunate to have ready access to the Grand Canyon, one of the seven natural wonders of the world. Tourists from all over the world travel to see the Canyon, as you soon realize when you are there watching a sunset and discover that many (most?) of those standing beside you are not speaking English."

Dr. Larry Fellows, born and raised in Iowa, earned degrees in geology from Iowa State College, University of Michigan, and University of Wisconsin. After working in petroleum exploration and teaching at the university level, he began employment at the Missouri Geological Survey. In 1979, Larry was selected to be director of the Arizona Geological Survey and the first official Arizona State Geologist, a position he held until his retirement in 2005. He transformed the Bureau of Geology and Mineral Technology into the modern Geological Survey.






