We are very fortunate to have another celebrated speaker for our August 12, 2017, OPLC meeting, Anna Domitrovic, from the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum, will present to us: MINERALOGY ALONG NORTHERN ARIZONA'S ROUTE 66

We will follow the first paved road in America, the famous Route 66, along some of the best preserved sections that stretch along northern Arizona, from Monument Valley and the Painted Desert, to Meteor Crater and the Grand Canyon, all the way west to Kingman, Chloride and Oatman. Copper and copper minerals, fossils, wulfenite, gold and silver, are some of the ores and minerals that we'll look at.

Anna Domitrovic studied geology at the Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, and has been a mineralogist-emeritus at the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum in Tucson for almost 40 years. She has a wealth of knowledge about Arizona minerals and rockhounding in this state!

## September 2017 Field Trip OPLC Members only

Alpine, AZ and Snowflake, AZ 5-8 September 2017

We will be searching for carnelian and blue agate on 6 and 7 September. 5 September will be a travel day. We will leave the Bear Wallow Restaurant in Alpine at 9am, after breakfast on both days. There are several sites to be visited. Bring your cameras as we spotted elk herds and turkeys last year. Each day we will be out 5-7 hours, so come prepared with lunch and drinks. Elevation varies from 8,000 feet upwards. Places to stay include Meadow Lodge, Sportsman Lodge and Alpine Inn. There are a couple of RV parks for those that camp either with an RV or tent. Dinner plans to be confirmed depending on how many sign up for this trip. Closest real grocery store is in Springerville, AZ. On Friday, 8 September we will travel to Snowflake area for a few hours of petrified wood hunting on a private ranch. None of the places we're going charge fees for collecting. Rule is 25 pounds plus one piece per day. We, Jerry and I, are staying at Tal-Wi-Wi. We drive a Jeep Wrangler and do not have room for anyone else. Most pickups do fine. Bring digging equipment. There is some surface collecting.

Routes there are either via Salt River Canyon, then through Pinetop and Springerville to Alpine, or through Safford. The road through Safford and Morenci is great if you have all the time in the world. However, it is not a fast drive. There are times when the mine canyon is right next to BOTH sides of the road. If your hair isn't already white, it will be afterwards. Hunting season begins on 8 September. Do wear some bright colored clothing so we can spot you. Weather is unknown at time of writing, but can be very cool at night.

Signup will be via email or telephone. Email is best as we live where cell service is spotty. We're going to Alpine even if there's only one other person that wants to do this. We need to collect liability forms from




