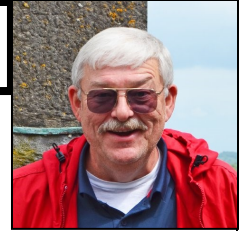

## PRIOR MONTH'S MEETING MINUTES... Patrick Droll, Secretary

11/10/18 – 9:00 AM at OPLC – Bill Penrose (for Pat Droll)

Sindi Schloss, gemologist and appraiser from Scottsdale, gave an excellent presentation on Ethnic Symbolism in Global Jewelry.

Snacks were provided by Abe and Norma Lackow and Victoria Fila.

The minutes from last month's meeting minutes were seconded and approved.

Before the start of the usual business meeting, Dave Schulte reviewed the OPLC laboratory Code of Conduct for the membership. The Powerpoint presentation was prepared by Jean and Skip Barkley.
