Minutes of OPLC Membership Meeting Bill Penrose, 12/14/19 11:00 am

The meeting was kept brief, since it was to be followed by the holiday feast.

Treasurer's Report (Pat Droll) – The finances of the Club are healthy. As of 11/30, we had spent 67% of the 2019 budget, although some expenses, like new wheels, still had to be purchased. Insurance payments were also due before year's end

Membership Report (Janet Keisler) – We have 464 members paid up for 2019, and 114 renewals for 2020 so far. Memberships must be renewed before using the labs in 2020.

Field Trips (Victoria Fila) – A trip to Duquesne (S. of Patagonia) on Jan 18 is already fully subscribed. A trip to the White Mountains for peridot is planned for March, and another field trip is in the works for April (TBA).

Insurance – Insurance is in place for 2020 except coverage on buildings and facilities. The nearest quote is \$1000 over the last year's premium. We will have insurance in place by year's end.

Updated Display – The display cabinets in the meeting hall have been rearranged to include a collection donated by Bob and Elaine Royer. Twink Monrad, Janet Keisler, and John Poole produced the new display.

Cab Lab – The new mini-split AC unit has been installed in the cab lab. Slab saws

have been out of commission while waiting for parts, including worm drives and new blades.

Silver, Faceting, Casting, and Saw Labs – all running smoothly except for holiday interruptions.

County Fair Display – Members were asked to volunteer for a shift at the county fair in April. Full 8-hour shifts have been divided into two four hour shifts to accommodate people who can't spare an entire day.

Meeting Refreshments – Leia Ballard requested that members volunteer to bring refreshments for monthly meetings. Purchases will be reimbursed up to \$40.

David Schulte publicly thanked volunteers who have helped to make the club successful over the past three years of his tenure as president.

Election of Officers – The slate for 2020 is President – Victoria Fila Vice President – Malcolm Currie Treasurer – Pat Droll (temporary due to withdrawal of candidate for personal

reasons)

Secretary – Bill Penrose

Board – Three members: Ted Rupp, John Poole and Mark Davidson

There were no nominations from the floor, and all members of the slate were voted in unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 am and the holiday meal begun.






