



# July 14, 2018 OPLC speaker: Patti Polk Agates & Jaspers of the Southwest







We are very fortunate to have Patti Polk- rockhound, lapidary, jewelry artist and author, to give us a great presentation "Agates & Jaspers of the Southwest" for our July 14, 2018 OPLC monthly meeting.

Patti Polk, known to the rockhounding world as AGATEGRRRL, is a rockhound who loves collecting agates for well over 20 years, especially banded fortification types and agates with inclusions such as tube, moss, plume, and sagenite. She says that she "is not a big a big digger or commercial collector, and mostly does surface collecting, prospecting and hiking to pick up beautiful agates. Then she loves cutting and polishing the stones she finds, and make jewelry and art pieces".

In 2010 she published her first book *Collecting Rocks, Gems and Minerals*, in which I was personally honored to be included with two photos. That book is now in its 3<sup>rd</sup> edition. In 2013, her book *Collecting Agates and Jaspers of North America* followed, and just this year *The Crystal Guide* was published. 


