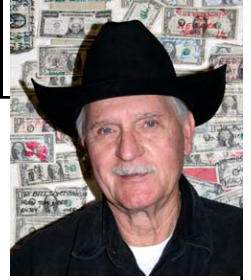

The annual Hob Nob meeting was held at OPLC on February 6th and was attended by approximately 90 facetors from around the world. The highlight of the evening was a competition for



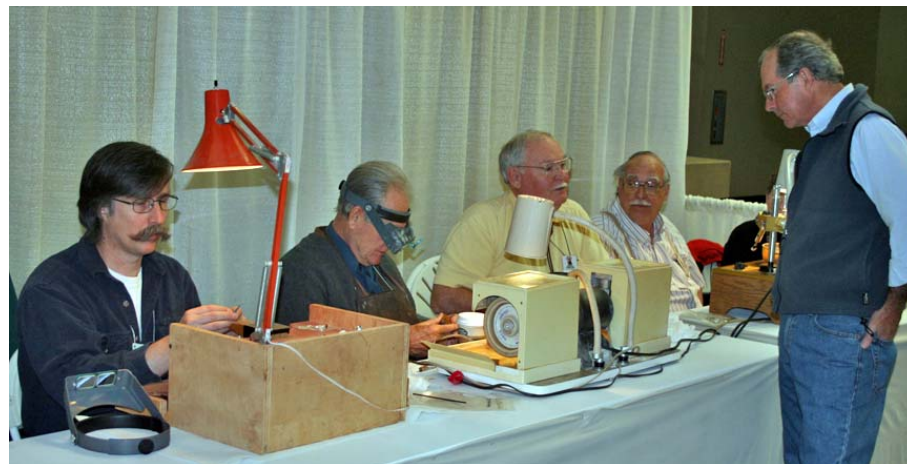
cut stones in two categories; one for best cut natural stone and the other was for best cut synthetic stone. Art Kavan won the competition for the best cut synthetic stone and one of his former students, Tomohiro Karino won for the best cut natural stone. Both had stones in each category. Tomohiro's stone was faceted from Kunzite and had 93 facets and Art's stone was cut from CZ and had 385 facets. Art and Tomohiro had entries in both categories. There were 17 stones competing in the Natural category and 11 stones in the synthetic category.

OPLC once again had a booth at the February, 2010 Tucson Convention Center to demonstrate some of the activities that the Club has to offer and answer questions.

OTHER USES FOR A COFFEE FILTER (And this is just a start ... there's more)

Coffee filters Who knew! And you can buy 1,000 at the Dollar Tree for almost nothing even the large ones.

1. Cover bowls or dishes when cooking in the microwave. Coffee filters make excellent covers.
2. Clean windows, mirrors, and chrome... Coffee filters are lint-free so they'll leave windows sparkling.
3. Use them to wrap Christmas ornaments for storage.
4. Use as a disposable "snack bowl" for popcorn, chips, etc.
5. Protect China by separating your good dishes with a coffee filter between each dish.
6. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.
7. Recycle frying oil. After frying, strain oil through a sieve lined with a coffee filter.
8. Weigh chopped foods. Place chopped ingredients in a coffee filter on a kitchen scale.
9. Hold tacos. Coffee filters make convenient wrappers for messy foods.
10. Stop the soil from leaking out of a plant pot. Line a plant pot with a coffee filter to prevent the soil from going through the drainage holes.
11. Prevent a Popsicle from dripping. Poke one or two holes as needed in a coffee filter.
12. Protect a cast-iron skillet. Place a coffee filter in the skillet to absorb moisture and prevent rust.
13. Apply shoe polish. Ball up a lint-free coffee filter.
14. Do you think we used expensive strips to wax eyebrows? Use strips of coffee filters.
15. Put a few in a plate and put your fried bacon, French fries, chicken fingers, etc on them. It soaks out all the grease.
16. Keep in the bathroom. They make great "razor nick fixers."
17. As a sewing backing. Use a filter as an easy-to-tear backing for embroidering or appliquing soft fabrics.
18. Put baking soda into a coffee filter and insert into shoes or a closet to absorb or prevent odors.
19. Use them to strain soup stock and to tie fresh herbs in to put in soups and stews.
20. Use coffee filters as blotting paper for pressed flowers. Place the flowers between two coffee filters and put the coffee filters in phone book.

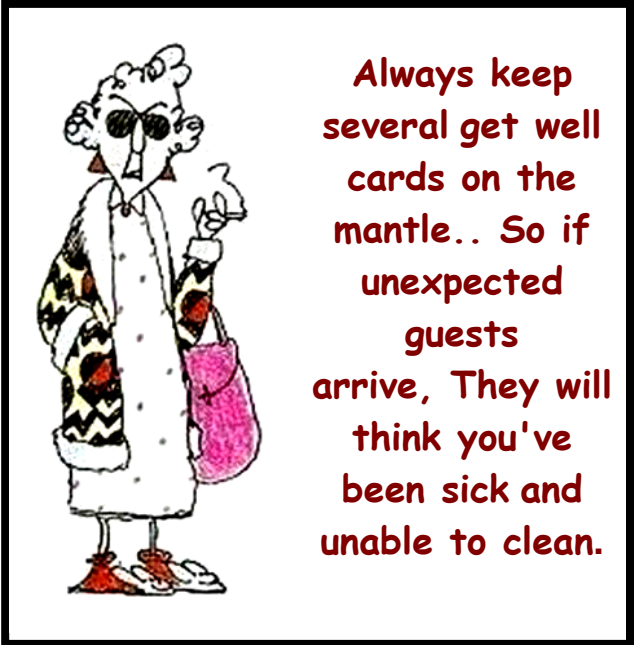

HELPFUL HINT

Cabochon RemovalA quick and safe way to remove a cabochon that gets stuck in the bezel of a finding when grinding for a perfect fit: Put the cab on a towel. Boil a cup of water. With needle nose pliers or tweezers, nab the offending cab and dip it in the hot water (a minute is usually enough). Remove the cab and tap it very gently with a pencil and it should drop out free and unharmed. The metal of the finding will expand more quickly than the stone and therefore the stone drops out.

Do NOT try this with opals!

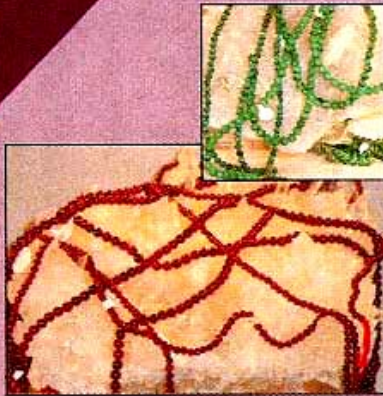
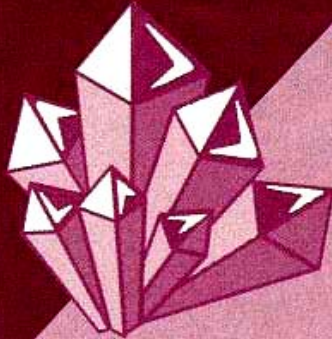

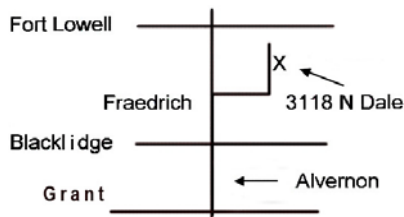
