## October 2018 OPLC speaker: Nick Saccketti- A New Wave In Fluorescent Mineral Displays



We are very fortunate to have another special speaker for our October 13, 2018 OPLC monthly meeting. Nick Saccketti, is the director of programs for the Prescott Gem and Mineral Club, and a member of the research group of the Fluorescent Mineral Society. He will be talking about "A New Wave in Fluorescent Mineral Displays".

Fluorescent minerals have been admired and displayed ever since the phenomenon of fluorescence was described by Sir George Stokes in 1852; minerals which converted ultraviolet light to visible light, by a mechanism which has since been named the Stokes shift. Nearly every display since that time has used either arc or low-pressure mercury lamps for generation of the ultraviolet used to produce the fluorescence. Recently, however, the advent of near-UV and UV LEDs and diode lasers has opened up a new frontier in displays, and combining UV technology with modern digital beam-steering creates the possibilities for new artistic expression in displays.

Nick Saccketti retired from a career at Raytheon Missile Systems five years ago, and since then has been researching and developing new display techniques for fluorescent minerals. The research combines his previous optical, sensors and controls engineering background with the hobby that he has enjoyed for over 50 years. He is presently working with the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum on a unique display of Fluorescent Minerals. Over the past three years the continual progress in displays has been showcased at the Prescott Gem and Mineral Club's annual show.

Nick Saccketti is coming down from Prescott, so please do not miss this presentation! Looking forward to seeing you all, Helen Serras-Herman, OPLC Program chair

been turned off and Pat and his helper will be installing the new on demand hot water heater this month. Thanks to Pat for his efforts!

- Reminder to donate cans to the club and crush them if possible as we get more money for the crushed can's (\$0.10 more per pound) then uncrushed.
- OPLC board 2019 nomination status Twink. We are always looking for fresh ideas on how to improve the club and welcome all members to join the board and help make it better for everyone. I would like to hand the reigns of the presidency over next year and if you are interested in this position, please see me after the meeting. November is the deadline for submitting your name for a club position. The voting will occur at the December club meeting.
- The guillotine plate cutting tool in the silver lab was damaged in two different locations on the blades as a result of someone cutting material that was not meant to be cut in this tool (most likely steal or possibly even a rock). ONLY non-ferrous plate material up to 14 gauge may be cut on the guillotine. Anyone cutting anything else on this tool will purchase the club new blades for the tool. Unfortunately the person responsible for damaging this equipment was not forth coming in admitting it. The tool has been repaired and is back up in the silver lab. Springs have been added to the hand guard to allow plate to be easily slid under this brace and aligned for cutting. The guard is NOT to be removed ever when cutting plate material.
- We have purchased a new 20 ton press and are working to get a 6 inch by 6 inch plate affixed to the jack to ensure even pressure application. This new tool should be up and working next month.




