Minutes of OPLC Membership Meeting September 11, 2021 9:00 AM at OPLC Bill Penrose, Secretary, wrp0143@comcast.net

A quorum of the membership was present, at least 40 members.

The speaker was Elaine Royer, speaking on "Swarovsky Crystals", a form of jewelry built from metal-coated glass, and the long history of this form.

A moment was reserved to remember members who have passed in the previous year: Abe Lackow, Robert Powell, Billy Bob Riley, and Skip Barkley.

In the absence of published minutes, the meeting of August 14 was approved.

Treasurer's Report (Mark Davidson) – As of May 31, the next income for Jan-August of 2021 was \$2446. Upcoming insurance payments are likely to force net income into the negative temporarily. The summer silent auction earned \$1125.

Membership Report (Janet Keisler) – Total members in good standing 352. At least six new members introduced themselves.

Silent auction – A lot of equipment and rock have been accumulated for the November silent auction.

Field trips – October 23 – Fourth of July Butte (jasper and agate in a variety of colors). Meet at the Pilot in Gila Bend, exit at Butterfield Road. Gila Bend is 110 miles from Tucson. November 27 – the annual peridot trip to the White Hills east of Show Low. Later trips – Pearce (Hwy 191 south of Willcox) various quartz forms in former gold field Safford – (Hwy 191 north of Willcox) for apache tears.

Labs – All labs are fully open. Current versions are available in the labs and on the Old Pueblo Lapidary Club Lab Monitors Group on Facebook.

Volunteers are needed for the TGMS Show in February 2022 and the County Fair in April. Monitors are needed for all labs.

Christmas Party – a decision was deferred pending the uncertain behavior of the pandemic.

Elections – a nominating committee must be appointed to be presented to the membership in November, voted on in December, and installed in January.

October 2021 OPLC speaker: Les Presmyk

Quartz - Another Mineral Arizona Should be Famous For



We are in for special treat for our October 9, 2021, OPLC monthly meeting. Les Presmyk will give us a presentation on **Quartz - Another Mineral Arizona Should be Famous For.**

Although quartz specimens may not be the first, second or even third mineral species one thinks of from Arizona, there are a number of localities that have produced fine specimens. On the lapidary side of our hobby, Arizona's fire agates, gem silica, and its multitude of agate and jasper localities are certainly well known, as is the world-class amethyst stones from Four Peaks. Some of Arizona's specimen quartz localities are the result of its long mining history. Sparkly, drusy quartz crystals covering chrysocolla, along with quartz colored by chrysocolla and pseudomorphs have been produced from the Old Dominion Mine (Globe), the Live Oak Mine (Miami), the Ray Mine (Kearny) and the Bagdad Mine (Bagdad). Then, there is a number of Arizona's quartz localities recovered as the result of collectors working the areas for specimens. These include Date Creek Ranch, the Fat Jack Claim near Crown King, the Huachuca Mountains south of Sierra Vista, Diamond Point northeast of Payson, the Stanley Butte area on the San Carlos Apache Tribe Reservation, and the Washington Camp/Duquesne localities in southern Arizona, to name a few. These localities have produced fine scepters, Japan-Law twins, amethyst, smoky quartz and even lustrous, clear and amethyst crystals that rival the famous Herkimer, New York crystals.

Les shared that the 2023 Tucson Show theme will be Silica which will give us an opportunity to show the rest of the collecting world the quality of Arizona quartz specimens.

Les Presmyk and his wife Paula are Arizona natives and University of Arizona graduates. Following graduation, they both went to work in the mines, he as a mining engineer at the Magma Mine in Superior, Arizona and she as an assayer and chemist for the Miami Copper Company in Miami, Arizona. After the mines closed down, they moved to Mesa and then to Gilbert, where they have resided since 1986.

Les has made presentations at various mineral symposia and clubs. He received the 2017 Carnegie Mineralogical Award and in 2020 will become a 50 year member of SME, the Society of Mining, Metallurgical and Exploration Engineers.


