

When attending a lab, be sure to call first and make sure the lab is proceeding as scheduled. Only paid-up members are allowed to use the labs, for insurance reasons.


THE NEW BOARD AND EXECUTIVE WERE SWORN IN at this point in the meeting.


The raffle brought in about \$240.



#### February 1, 2025, OPLC speaker Renée Newman

#### The Diversity of American Gems, Western States







We are in for a wonderful presentation for our February 1, 2025, OPLC monthly meeting by internationally acclaimed gemologist and author of 14 books, Renée Newman. The dates have aligned this year to allow for Renée to be our speaker, as she always comes to Tucson during the first week of gem shows.

Renée's PowerPoint presentation will include gems from California, Oregon, Washington, Arizona, Nevada, and Idaho. She will focus on the most notable ones such as tourmaline, jade, benitoite, sunstone, opal, turquoise, chrysocolla, fire agate and Four Peaks amethyst, and the places where they are mined.

Renée Newman developed her interest in gems in the early 1980s while conducting tours to Asia, South America, and the South Pacific. In order to answer her passengers' questions about gems, she decided to study gemology at the Gemological Institute of America (GIA).

After receiving a graduate gemologist diploma from the GIA, she was hired as a gemologist at a wholesale firm in downtown Los Angeles. It provided hands-on experience grading diamonds and selecting colored gems and pearls for their jewelry. Armed with trade experience and gemological credentials, Renée decided to create books that showed readers how to visually evaluate the quality of gems. Since 1989, she has written thirteen more books on gems and jewelry.




