July 13, 2024, OPLC speaker – Mark Marikos What's a Diamond Worth?





We are in for another great treat for our July 13, 2024 OPLC monthly meeting. Our very own member, Mark Marikos, is returning with a new presentation **What's a Diamond Worth?**

Mark shared, "We have all seen the mind-boggling prices that spectacular diamonds go for at auction and understand that they get those prices because diamonds are rare (at least near earth's surface), and they can be breathtakingly beautiful. However, those valuations understate the true value of diamonds to science, because of what diamonds reveal to us about what happens deep in the earth, beyond our reach. The strength of the diamond crystal structure makes it the perfect vessel for carrying small inclusions of mantle minerals from virtually any depth in the earth's mantle, bringing those samples to the surface intact. We have no other way of knowing about many of the minerals that form in the mantle. What we learn from diamond inclusions, and the diamonds themselves, allows us to understand many of the processes that occur in the mantle, and how those processes influence the overlying crust on which we live. And some of the less attractive diamonds reveal so much more because they have more inclusions. Diamonds are truly a geoscientist's best friend!"

Mark began collecting at the age of five. That led to him to pursue a degree in Geology and Geophysics from the University of Missouri-Rolla (now Missouri University of Science and Technology), followed by a master's degree. He worked as a staff geologist with the Missouri Geological Survey for 11 years, until insanity seized him, and he decided to go for one more degree, beginning at UCLA and then following his advisor to the University of Arizona. After a few years, he ran out of time, money and his wife's patience; the first two of which he could have done something about. He worked for a few more years as a geologist in several part-time and temporary mineral exploration positions, until the market went dry, and has for the last 22 years worked at the University of Arizona in Facilities Management. Though he no longer works as a geologist, it is still his hobby, and he is an avid reader of journal articles in the field.




